KUNDUZ, Afghanistan (Feb. 4, 2011) - A 10th Mountain Division Soldier with 1st Brigade Combat Team received the Silver Star Medal - the nation's third highest award for valor in combat - during a ceremony last week at Forward Operating Base Kunduz, in northern Afghanistan. First Lt. David Provencher, an infantry platoon leader with 1st Battalion, 87th Infantry Regiment, is credited with saving the lives of three wounded Soldiers and refusing to leave two others who were mortally wounded. 


ON POINT

The National Military Strategy for 2011 was released this week by Admiral M.G. Mullen, Chairman of the Joint Chiefs of Staff. Entitled *The National Military Strategy of the United States of America, 2011, Redefining America's Military Leadership*, the document provides the ways and means by which our military will advance our enduring national interests. The strategy outlines a vision of a Joint Force that provides military capability to defend our Nation and allies, and to advance broader peace, security and prosperity.

This National Military Strategy, per Admiral Mullen, emphasizes how the Joint Force will redefine America's military leadership to adapt to a challenging new era. The strategy advances three broad themes which focus on leadership, relationships with allies, and full spectrum capabilities.
