Ms. Debora C. Richert serves as the Chief of Staff for Joint Base Myer-Henderson Hall. She reported aboard on the 17th of April 2008. She has more than 34 years experience in federal service to include Army, Navy, and NASA in technical and management positions. During the 1980's, she supervised numerous environmental studies, compliance and restoration projects, and facilities operations.



From 1992 to 1994, she worked for the U.S. Army Reserve Command and was instrumental in implementing a nationwide storm water pollution prevention program at reserve centers.

From 1996 to 2002, Ms. Richert served as the Director of Environment and Safety at Fort Riley, Kan. She was responsible for building a nationally recognized environmental and safety program that highlighted operational efficiencies in safety, compliance, conservation and foundation programs. In her capacity as director, she oversaw the A76 study for her organization and subsequent in-house win by the government.

From 2003 to 2006, Ms. Richert served as the Environmental Chief at the Installation Management Agency (IMA), Northeast Region Office, responsible for managing the environmental base operations support, military training support, information and environmental reporting, and establishing outreach and regional assessments of operational processes. From Sep. 2004 to May 2005, Ms. Richert served as the interim Deputy to the Garrison Commander at Fort Belvoir, Va. Upon her return to IMA, she was designated the Base Realignment and Closure (BRAC) Chief, responsible for the proper identification and coordination of all the emerging requirements to implement BRAC realignments and closures for over 20 installations in the Northeast.

From Apr. 2006 to Apr. 2008, she was the Chief of Staff at the Sacramento District, which is one of the largest districts in the South Pacific Division. She was responsible for the overall administration of 850 people covering a seven state region and was instrumental in the implementation of the National Security Personnel System (NSPS) in 2007. Ms. Richert received her bachelor's in Liberal Arts from Pacific Lutheran University and her master's of Science Administration from Central Michigan University. She is a 2003 graduate of the Army War College with a master's in Strategic Studies.
