

The Suicide Prevention Program provides community and individual empowerment through education and awareness. The program is designed to minimize suicidal behavior; thereby preserving mission effectiveness through individual readiness for Soldiers, Family Members and Civilians.

We coordinate training for Soldiers, Family members, and civilians to develop and enhance suicide intervention skills using both the Applied Suicide Intervention Skills Training (ASIST) and Ask, Care, Escort (ACE) curriculum. The ASIST is primarily for gatekeepers such as Family Advocacy Program workers, medical providers, chaplains, squad leaders, and first line supervisors whose duties involve assisting people who are more susceptible to suicide ideations or by the nature of their job may come in contact with a person at risk. ACE is designed for peer-to-peer suicide intervention and is available to anyone in the community who wants to gain added skills, knowledge, and confidence to intervene in a crisis. USAG Humphreys observes Suicide Prevention Month in September. This awareness campaign allows leaders to highlight suicide prevention and its impact on Soldiers, Families, and the community.
