UNITED STATES ARMY GARRISON-YONGSAN (USAG-Y) POLICY LETTER 10-1

SUBJECT: U.S. Army Garrison-Yongsan (USAG-Y) Commander's Safety Council

1. **REFERENCES:**

- a. AR 385-10, The Army Safety Program, 27 November 2013.
- b. DA Pam 385-10, Army Safety Program, 19 January 2010.

2. **PURPOSE:** The council is a forum for discussing safety concerns and keeping garrison leadership informed on the status of the garrison accident rates, prevention programs, policies, and initiatives. The council will meet semi-annually or more frequently at the Commander's discretion.

3. **APPLICABILITY:** This policy applies to all USAG-Y Directorates.

4. **POLICY:** To heighten interest, acquire command engagement, identify safety issues relating to USAG-Y sharing lessons learned, and directing the use of the operational risk management process to detect and eliminate or control risk to mission, equipment, facilities, and personnel.

5. **MEMBERSHIP:**

- a. Commander, USAG-Y
- b. Deputy to the Garrison Commander, USAG-Y
- c. Command Sergeant Major, USAG-Y
- d. Safety Manager for Installation Safety Office (ISO)
- e. Director for Directorate of Human Resources (DHR)
- f. Director for Directorate of Public Works (DPW)
- g. Director for Directorate of Family, Morale, Welfare, and Recreation (DFMWR)
- h. Director for Directorate of Plans, Training, Mobilization and Security (DPTMS)
- i. Director for Directorate of Emergency Service (DES)

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- j. Director for Directorate of Resource Management (DRM)
- k. Director for Public Affairs Office (PAO)
- l. Headquarters and Headquarters Company (HHC) Commander
- m. Director for Civilian Personnel Advisory Center (CPAC)
- n. Fire Chief for Fire and Emergency Services Division (FESD)

6. Safety representatives from all organizations are encouraged to attend. The council provides an excellent opportunity to bring community safety issues to the attention of the Garrison Commander and council members for resolution. Organizations or individuals wishing to submit safety related issues to the council for consideration may do so by submitting the issue to the USAG-Y Safety Office not later than 10 days prior to the council. Units/organizations submitting issues must be in attendance to support and explain the need for change or resolution.

7. This policy is effective immediately and will remain in effect until rescinded or modified by the USAG-Y Commander.
