MEMORANDUM FOR All Military Personnel and Department of Defense Civilian Employees within Area IV United States Army Garrison, Daegu (USAG-D) Installations

SUBJECT: US Army Garrison (USAG) Daegu Policy Letter #42, Area IV, Standards of Dress and Prohibited Attire for Army Installations in Daegu

1. References.

2. This policy is effective immediately and remains in effect until rescinded or superseded.

3. Purpose. To establish a professional standard of appearance throughout Area IV and represent the United States as true ambassadors to our country.

4. Applicability. This policy applies to all Soldiers, Civilians, Family members, contractors, and other personnel who work on, reside on, or visit any US Army installations, facilities, or work sites in USAG-Daegu/Area IV. Failure to obey the guidelines of this policy could result in UCMJ for those of the Armed Services.

5. Policy. This policy provides uniformity in dress for all patrons of USAG-D/Area IV and tenant facilities. It is not designed to take away the freedom of individual dress but to ensure a standard exists across all operated facilities. Individuals failing to meet prescribed dress standards will be refused admittance to facilities located within Area IV Installations. Each officer and Noncommissioned Officer must set the example by correcting those who fail to observe this standard. It is our Army; be proud and professional.

- a. All military personnel must wear the prescribed uniform of the day while conducting military business at USAG-D/Area IV facilities. Exceptions include emergency situations and personnel in a leave status that have been approved by their

commander. Also exempted from this policy are Soldiers whose medical profile precludes their ability to wear the prescribed uniform of the day. In this case a clean Improved Physical Fitness Uniform (IPFU) is approved provided the Soldier has in their possession a valid profile.

b. The mixing of uniforms is prohibited; the only items of military clothing acceptable for wear with civilian attire, without insignia or rank, are windbreakers, sweaters, black all-weather coats, and overcoats.

c. Sponsors are responsible for the appearance, attire, and conduct of their Family members and they too are expected to conform to acceptable standards of dress as outlined within this Policy Memorandum.

d. Soldiers subsisting in USAG-D/Area IV dining facilities while in uniform must ensure their uniform is complete, clean, and neat. Headgear will not be worn and issue t-shirts, either white or brown in color, will not be worn as outer garments. Other prohibited clothing items in the dining facilities in Area IV are sleeveless shirts, toeless shoes, doo rags, hair rollers and running tights as an outer garment.

e. Soldiers can wear the IPFU/APFU on and off duty for fitness training. Soldier is NOT authorized to wear the IPFU/APFU in any installation facility other than a fitness center per 8<sup>th</sup> Army Blue Book.

f. A unit under General Order #1 where civilian attire has been restricted does not give you an exception to the wearing of your IPFU in any facility in Area IV. You must wear the ACU as your uniform in these facilities.

g. The wearing of civilian attire should be a matter of personal pride, and care should be taken by all Soldiers, Families, retirees, Civilians, and guests to ensure their clothing is clean, conservative, inoffensive, neat, and in accordance with the following guidelines. We have to remember that we are guest in an overseas location and are a representation of our country. The way we dress reflects on who we are as a nation:

(1) Shoes, boots, or sandals/flip flops/shower shoes must be worn at all times.

(2) Clothing that includes obscene, vulgar, distasteful, slanderous or sexually suggestive language is prohibited. Additionally, attire that depicts drug paraphernalia, glamorization of alcohol or any illegal activity is not permitted.

(3) Clothing which makes disparaging comments concerning the Military or the United States Government may not be worn in Area IV facilities.

(4) See-through garments and clothing which exposes the midriff are not permitted in Area IV facilities.

(5) Underwear may not be worn as outerwear or be otherwise clearly visible.

(6) Trousers cannot sag to an extent that underwear is exposed or be cut off where pocket linings are visible.

(7) Short shorts and short skirts that expose any part of the buttocks is not appropriate attire.

(8) Swim suits are only approved for wear at installation pools.

(9) Stocking caps or doo rags are prohibited in both on and off post establishments in Area IV.

(10) Hair curlers/rollers will not be worn without a scarf.

(11) Pajama's will not be worn as attire in any facilities in Area IV.

6. Failure of military personnel to follow these orders is a violation of Article 92 of UCMJ, and failure to obey order or regulation may result in administrative separation, nonjudicial or judicial punishment.
