UNITED STATES ARMY GARRISON-YONGSAN (USAG-Y) POLICY LETTER 5-20

MEMORANDUM FOR SEE DISTRIBUTION

SUBJECT: Prohibitions on the Possession and Use of Weapons, Destructive Devices, and Other Dangerous Items

1. **REFERENCES:**

a. Army Regulation (AR) 190-11, Physical Security of Arms, Ammunition, and Explosives, 05 September 2013.

b. AR 600-20, Army Command Policies, 18 March 2008.

c. United States Forces Korea (USFK) Regulation 27-5, Individual Conduct and Appearance, 07 July 2011.

d. USFK Regulation 190-16, Registration and Control of Privately Owned Firearms, 15 June 2014.

2. **APPLICABILITY:** This policy applies to all personnel assigned or attached to, visiting, or residing within USAG-Y Installations.

3. **GENERAL:** To ensure the peace and tranquility of all USAG-Y Installations the following rules are established:

a. A weapon is any device, including privately owned devices, that will eject a hard projectile by any explosive, mechanical, or compressed air means (except children's toys which eject soft projectiles) or any device that may, by its design or manner of employment, be used to inflict death or serious injury. The term "weapon" also includes, but is not limited to, all types of BB guns, air rifles or pistols, pellet guns, and slingshots.

b. Personnel will not, except as required in the performance of official duties and as authorized by law or regulation, acquire, own, possess, manufacture, transport, or use

any of the items listed in Encl 1. All privately owned firearms will be registered and stored in accordance with (IAW) provisions of USFK Reg. 190-16.

c. Privately owned weapons and/or firearms will not be used by persons under eighteen (18) years of age unless those persons are under the direct, personal supervision of an individual who is twenty one (21) years of age or older.

d. Toy guns that project plastic pellets will not be used by individuals who are less than eighteen (18) years of age unless they are under the direct, personal supervision of a person who is twenty one (21) years of age or older.

e. If approved for use, items will only be used at a facility designed for its use and will be stored and transported IAW this policy.

4. **SANCTIONS:**

a. Violations of this policy by individuals subject to the Uniform Code of Military Justice (UCMJ) may constitute violations of Article 92, UCMJ, subjecting the individual to criminal punishments and administrative sanctions.

b. Violations of this policy by individuals not subject to the Uniform Code of Military Justice may subject the individual to administrative sanctions and civilian criminal prosecution.

c. Anything listed in enclosure 1 that is in violation of this policy letter will be confiscated and disposed of IAW applicable regulations.

5. **RESPONSIBILITIES:**

a. Commanders - Ensure USFK Military personnel, the civilian components, and Family members comply with this policy.

b. USAG-Y Commander - Enforce the provisions of this policy as the misconduct action authority for violations covered by USFK Regulation 600-52, Civilian Misconduct.

c. USAG-Y Provost Marshal Office (PMO) - Enforce the provisions of this policy through the use of patrols, incident reports, and/or other appropriate measures.

d. USAG-Y Director of Emergency Services (DES) –

(1) Is the designated representative of the USAG-Y Commander and has supervisory responsibility over the USAG-Y Prohibitions on the Possession and Use of Weapons, Destructive Devices, and Other Dangerous Items Policy.

(2) Is the USAG-Y POC for this command policy.
