


The Army University

“Educating Army Professionals to Win in a Complex World”

We the undersigned are committed to establishing a university system within the United States Army to improve investment in education, transform our academic institutions, and grow professionals with the intellectual capacity to win in a complex world. The Army University will become a premier learning institution for the Total Army developing both military and civilian professionals who can understand and operate successfully within a complex future security environment. The Army University will accomplish this by increasing the rigor of the Army’s educational programs through broader accreditation, promoting greater collaboration with the Nation’s premier universities and colleges, and improving integration among Army schools. As the security environment continues to evolve, the Army University will deliver crucial educational requirements in advance of need, lead through innovation, and develop a culture that values life-long learning.

THEREFORE, WE THE CHARTER MEMBERS OF THE ARMY UNIVERSITY,
PROCLAIM THE FOLLOWING IDEALS AND BELIEFS:

- The Army University represents a greater investment in our Soldiers and Civilians through improved education that will increase competence, character, and commitment.
