SUBJECT: U.S. Army Garrison (USAG) Daegu Policy Letter #61, Garrison Energy Steering Committee (GESC) Appointment

1. Reference:

a. Executive Order #13693, Planning for Federal Sustainability in the Next Decade, 19 March 2015

2. Purpose: The purpose of this Appointment is to form a Garrison Energy Steering Committee (GESC) which supports the Army's energy strategy and campaign to reduce energy and water waste, and to build and execute effective energy management program with efficient, eco-friendly, and cost-saving technological projects.

a. The GESC will meet on a quarterly basis to review activities affecting Garrison energy and water consumption and will review local goal performance, discuss ideas, evaluate successes, and develop strategies for improvement.

b. The GESC will establish the standards and responsibilities for proper execution of USAG Daegu energy awareness and conversation program. USAG Daegu is committed to operating in an environmentally responsible manner, promoting increased energy efficiency throughout the Garrison to protect the environment and to ensure compliance with the governing regulations.

c. Objectives:

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- (1) Eliminate energy waste in all existing facilities
- (2) Reduce dependence on fossil fuels
- (3) Conserve water resources
- (4) Increase energy efficiency in new construction and renovations
- (5) Improve energy securities
- (6) Share energy conservation ideas
- (7) Benchmark best practices from government agencies and leading industries

3. Background: The Executive Order #13693 (Reference A) mandates that every U.S. army installation to improve energy efficiency and reduce greenhouse gas emissions through reduction of energy intensity by 2.5% annually through the end of fiscal year 2025 using 2015 as baseline year. The Garrison and its leadership will make energy conservation effort part of everyone's responsibility and will build on energy stewardship making it a team effort with individual accountabilities for the use or abuse of these vital resources.

4. Representatives: The following tenant units and Garrison directorates will appoint a representative for the USAG Daegu GESC.

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- j. Director of Plans, Analysis, and Integration Office (PAIO)
- k. Director of Emergency Services (DES)
- l. Director of Plans, Training, Mobilization, and Security Office (DPTMS)
- m. Director of Family, Morale, Welfare, and Recreations (FMWR)
- n. U.S. Army Corps of Engineers – Southern District
- o. 19th ESC Engineering
- p. 36th Signal Brigade
- q. Materials Support Command – Korea (MSC-K)
- r. Defense Logistics Agency (DLA)
- s. Department of Defense Education Activity (DoDEA)
- t. USAG Legal Office

5. Appointment: With this appointment, it is recognized that the representatives listed in paragraph #4 have operational expertise, situational awareness, and are each capable of representing the perspective of their activity in energy and water savings aspects. These individuals are enthusiastic about and committed operating in an environmentally responsive manner and promoting increased energy efficiency throughout the Garrison in order to protect the environment, reduce energy and water waste, and to ensure compliance with current regulations and policies.

6. Agenda: Garrison organizations and units are encouraged to submit concerns and questions to Garrison energy manager directly or any of GESC members. GESC members will forward all potential agenda items to the chairman for consideration at least 14 calendar days prior to the next meeting scheduled. The final GESC agenda will be approved by the Garrison Commander and will be forwarded to all GESC members 7 calendar days prior to the GESC meeting. Meetings will be scheduled in conjunction with the quarterly Environmental Quality Controls Committee (EQCC) meetings.

7. Sub Charters: The GESC may create sub-charters to address emergency issues as required. The sub-charters are intended to provide specific information or background study to the committee and to provide opportunities for non-voting members involvement.

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8. Member Negotiations: For the purpose of an effective program, members of the committee will formulate a strategy that will be to the benefit of the AOR (Area of Responsibility). The format of the meetings will provide facts and evidence which will substantiate a recommended course of action. Initiatives for changes or new processes will be submitted by members and considered part of the meeting agenda.

9. Final Decision: The GESC will render a final decision to agenda items by the following GESC meeting. The commission may extend the decision period for complex issues until the matter is solved.
