


# Joint Phasing Model



Phase	Action
Phase 0	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Prepare</li> <li>• Prevent</li> </ul>
Phase I	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Crisis defined</li> </ul>
Phase II	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Ensure friendly freedom of action</li> <li>• Access theater infrastructure</li> </ul>
Phase III	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Establish dominant force capabilities</li> <li>• Achieve enemy culmination or joint force commander's favorable conditions for transition</li> </ul>
Phase IV	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Establish security</li> <li>• Restore service</li> </ul>
Phase V	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Transfer to civil authorities</li> <li>• Redeploy</li> </ul>
