Mr. Paul Wysocki serves as the Chief of the Operations Management Division (OMD) for the U.S. Army's Logistics Modernization Program (LMP). In this role, he oversees a dedicated team of civilians and contractors that manage the program's operations and strategic communications efforts. Specifically, he provides leadership, guidance, and oversight of all program taskers, briefings, marketing, strategic communications, reporting, requests for information, and audits. The tactical information provided and managed by Mr. Wysocki and his team informs the Product Management Office's (PMO) mission and strategies. He regularly interacts with and provides information to the LMP's chain of command, including the Department of the Army, Office of the Secretary of Defense, and Congress.

Mr. Wysocki joined the LMP in 2006, serving the program as both a government employee and contractor. With his extensive SAP background and knowledge of the LMP, Mr. Wysocki provided training to end users for both the LMP second and third deployments in 2009 and 2010, as well as provided support for business process improvements at sites using the system. After becoming the LMP Operations Management assistant division chief and chief in 2011 and 2013, respectively, he tailored his knowledge to design and control the PMO's operations processes and procedures. Today, his leadership and guidance ensures that the operations team provides efficient and effective support to meet LMP mission and management requirements.

Mr. Wysocki earned a Bachelor of Science in Business Administration from Delaware Valley College. He has been recognized as the LMP Employee of the Quarter (December 2007), and was presented with the Aviation and Missile Command (AMCOM) Partnership Recognition for Delivery of LMP Integration 101 to Senior Level Management in Huntsville, Alabama (2007), and Anniston Army Depot (ANAD) Coin for Delivery of LMP Overview Education to Leadership (2008).
