Maintain Vigilance! Report Suspicious Activity!

Observations

Recent reporting has identified suspicious individuals photographing U.S. installations, loitering near U.S. Garrison entrances, and counting vehicle convoys. These could be indicators of pre-operational surveillance or planning, and pose a threat to U.S. Service Members, Families, and Civilians.

Preserving Your Safety

Security personnel and gate guards are advised to be on alert for indications of pre-operational surveillance for an attack. Such behavior could include individuals taking photographs of U.S. Garrison entrances/exits or identifying patterns of U.S. operations; and asking probing security-related questions.

Public vigilance and awareness campaigns such as the **“if you see something, say something”** initiative play an important role in identifying suspicious behavior, as well as in identifying unattended packages, bags, and other items which could be used in terrorist attacks to conceal an IED or other weapons. Information sharing and prompt reporting of suspicious behavior indicators between the public, gate guards, and law enforcement (Military Police) are vital to the deterrence, detection, and disruption of terrorist activity and the prevention of attacks.

There are currently no known threats to USFK Personnel; however, incidents abroad can serve as triggers for attacks by terrorist groups and their sympathizers.
