Joint Base Myer-Henderson Hall announces its next quarterly Public Open House of Grant Hall's historic third-floor courtroom, located on the Fort McNair portion of the Joint Base in southwest Washington D.C., from 10 a.m. to 4 p.m. Saturday, Aug. 5. The courtroom is the site of the military tribunal, held from May through June 1865, of those thought responsible for the plot to assassinate President Abraham Lincoln. Members of the public are invited to the Public Open House, which is free to attend. Guests without a Department of Defense (DoD), federal or AIE (Automated Installation Entry) ID are asked to register in advance.
