Grant Hall Open House Nov. 4

FORT MCNAIR, Washington, D.C. – Joint Base Myer-Henderson Hall announces its next quarterly Public Open House of Grant Hall's historic third-floor courtroom, located on the Fort McNair side of the Joint Base in southwest Washington D.C., from 10 a.m. to 4 p.m. on Saturday, Nov. 4. The courtroom is the site of the military tribunal, held from May through June 1865, of those thought responsible for the plot to assassinate President Abraham Lincoln.

During a 2009-2012 renovation of Grant Hall, which was originally part of Washington's Federal Penitentiary

from 1829 to 1868, the third floor of the building was restored to depict the courtroom as it appeared during the 1865 trial. Courtroom features were recreated based on artistic renderings and written descriptions of court proceedings. Some furnishings and artifacts on display are on loan from the production company of a 2011 historical film about the trial, and other artifacts and documentation are from the National Defense University Library.

Members of the public are invited to the Public Open House, which is free to attend. Guests without a De-

Army Ten-Miler Oct. 8

The Army's 33rd annual Army Ten-Miler (ATM) is set for Sunday, Oct. 8, starting at 8 a.m. at the Pentagon. The Wounded Warrior and Wheelchair athletes start at 7:40 a.m. Runners must pick up their packets at the ATM Expo, Oct. 6 -7, held at the D.C. Armory located at 2001 E. Capitol Street, SE, Washington, D.C. Registration and packet pick up must happen at this time. There is NO race

day packet pick up.

In preparing for the race, please be mindful that the following items are prohibited on the Race Course: Personal music devices (headphones, MP3 players, iPods, etc.); edged weapons/cutting devices; any form of firearm; any explosive/flammable/combustible items, materials, or devices; aerosol sprays (pepper or

mace); strollers or baby-joggers; inline or quad roller skates; skateboards; bicycles; pets/animals (except disability or service canines); glass containers or bottles; and any vulgar or obscene flags/banners/signs or clothing/attire. No Backpacks.

Renew your Henry Gate Access

Reminder! Soldiers, residents, and civilians wanting to enter the installation via the Henry Gate portal must first activate their CAC or Military Dependent Card with the Visitor Control Center at the JBM-HH Police Station. The process includes the registration of biometrics (finger prints) and limits users to one-year of entry through the gate. Make sure to note the date of registration, as you will need

to renew one year following the date. This privilege is currently only available to CAC and Military Dependent Card holders. Please make sure to check that your card itself is current, as expired cards will not be allowed entry at any gate.

Traffic pattern change @ Hatfield Gate

Friday, Oct. 6, Public Works and Emergency Services will install temporary buildings at Fort Myer's Hatfield Gate which calls for a short-lived traffic pattern change at Hatfield Gate.

From 8 to 11 p.m., all inbound vehicle traffic will be routed north on Sheridan Avenue for entry. No vehicles will be allowed to exit Fort Myer via Sheridan Avenue, and vehicular traffic will have to exit via Carpenter Road.
