ARMY CAMPUS- STYLE DINING VENUES (CSDV)





ARMY CSDVS ADD VALUE

Soldiers living barracks have \$13.65 per day deducted for their daily provided meals - no different than usual. At the CSDVs, three meals a day converts to \$39 in value.





\$39 VALUE FOR 3 MEALS A DAY

For meal card holders, the Army's
Campus-Style Dining Venue
contractor converts meal values to:

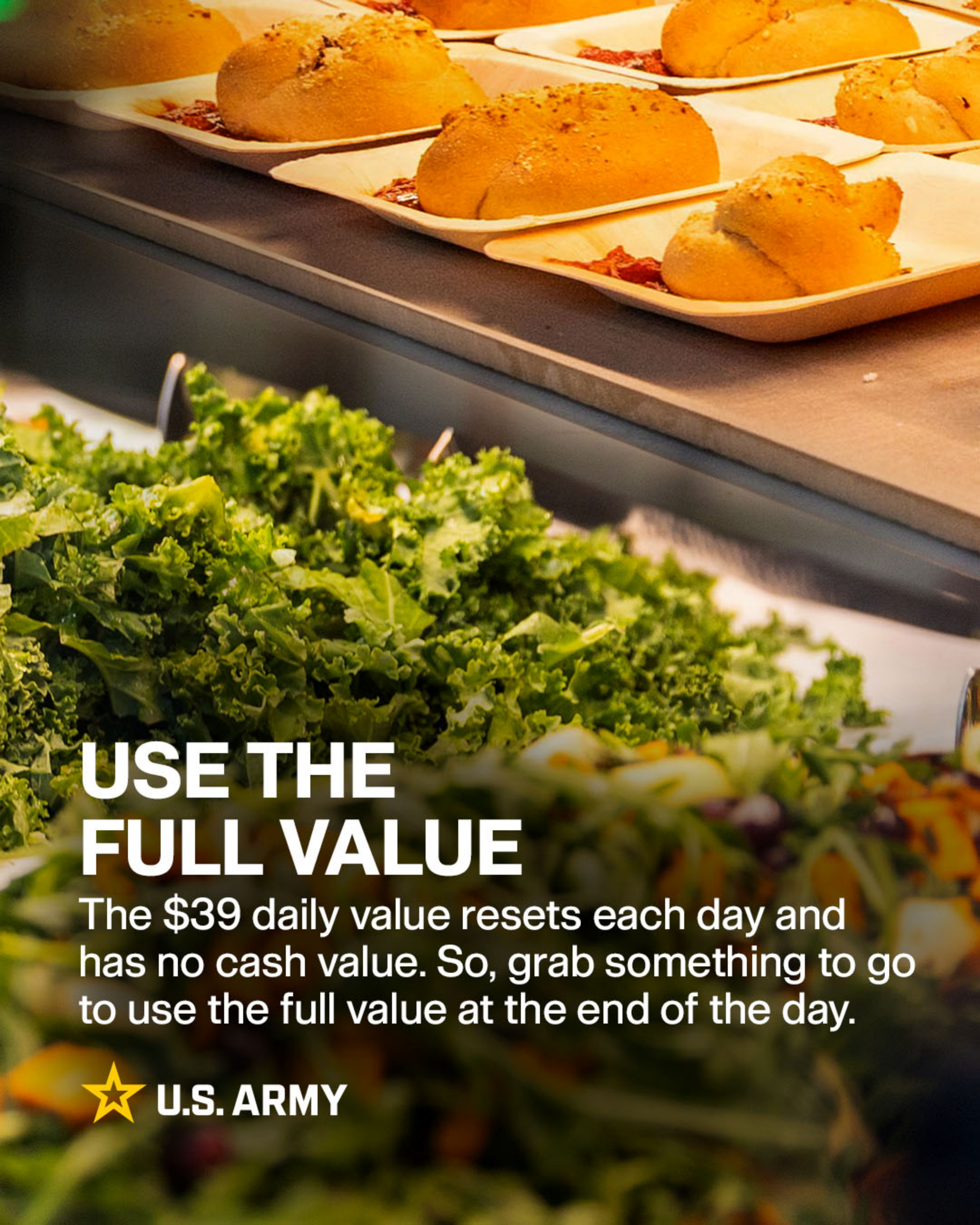
- \$9.57 breakfast
- \$15.86 lunch
- \$13.57 dinner

VERIFY YOUR MEAL ENTITLEMENT CODE

As a meal card holder, you must verify that your Meal Entitlement Code is set to 09 by your unit S-1 for CAC scan access. Soldiers with MEC 09 can see the remaining balance on each receipt.





USE THE FULL VALUE

The \$39 daily value resets each day and has no cash value. So, grab something to go to use the full value at the end of the day.

DINE YOUR WAY

Spend your dollars at the restaurant any time throughout the day. Unused breakfast funds can roll into lunch and dinner, for example.



ONE-SCAN-PER-MEAL

If your breakfast scan at the CSDV goes over \$9.57 value, use part of your lunch scan to cover the difference; however, this means the remainder of your lunch scan value must be used at the CSDV. You cannot scan again for lunch at another military dining location (like a food truck, kiosk or DFAC).



NO EXTRA CHARGE

Soldiers living in the barracks are NOT paying anything extra for this program, unless they exceed the \$39 value per day.



OPEN TO ALL

Everyone else is welcome to dine at the restaurants and pay a la carte on what they order, just as they would at any other dining establishment.
